#### PRESIDENT'S OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR 2014

**Happy New Year, everyone!** I want to thank the RHS Alumni Association Board of Trustees and the docents for their dedication, hard work and for keeping everything running smoothly this year. Kim Boldi, Class of 1980, and Bruce Pendleton, Class of 1958, joined the board this year. Two outstanding board members will be rotating off the board next year – Treasurer, Gloria Garaventa, Class of 1951; and Membership Chairman, Nettie Wong, Class of 1956. We sincerely thank them and wish them the best. We are in need of additional alumni to serve as Board members.

The big event this year was the highly successful 7<sup>th</sup> Triennial All-Class Reunion held on August 17, 2014 on the RHS campus. About 675 attended and were treated to classic cars around the circle in front of the school, a visit to the museum, an opportunity to buy RHS gear, a wonderful lunch catered by Pinocchio's, a tour through Reno High, and best of all, a chance to meet up with old classmates and swap "war stories." Special thanks to the Reunion Committee, JROTC cadets, and Student Leadership students for their help.

We awarded four scholarships to deserving seniors and coordinated the awarding of the Westover Family Scholarship in May. The RHS Alumni Leadership Medal and certificate was given to an outstanding JROTC cadet.

The Alumni Center was used by the Principal for 8<sup>th</sup> grade orientation in May. We provided the incoming students with a brief history of Reno High School and Alumni Association. The center was open for Parent Night in September and also used for 3 days by RHS teachers for Freshman Seminar. The AAA (Athletics, Academics, and Activities) Club held a meeting at the museum and was provided a brief history of RHS, Alumni Association and museum. Washoe County School District also used our facilities as well as JROTC Classes and We the People participants. The museum continued to be open to the public on Fridays and Saturdays but closed on holiday weekends.

Four quarterly *Huskie Trails* alumni newsletters were published and received positive comments from members. Seven life members were added this year. The Class of 1949 became a Bronze Level Sponsor

There are 523 members who pay dues and support the Association. This is very low compared to the many thousand graduates who aren't members. We are always in need of more members.

- 6. The RHS boy's tennis team was unbeaten during the season, won regionals, but lost at state.
- 7. There are four National Merit Scholar semifinalists this year Sierra Jickling, Tyler Hart, Clay Harrison, and Matt Biondi.
- 8. Lt Col Nicole Gardner, RHS JROTC cadets, and color guard were acknowledged for their outstanding contributions to this year's Journal Jog.
- 9. RHS football coach, **Dan Avansino** was elected to the Carroll College (Montana)Hall of Fame. Over a three-week period in the fall of 1996, Dan tied the school record for rushing touchdowns in a game, recorded the program's third best rushing game, and shattered the single game rushing record by more than 75 yards. He was selected a 1996 first team NAIA All-American. Dan has been the RHS varsity football coach since 2000.

#### **ALUMNI NEWS**

- 1. **Joyce Nielsen Laxalt**, Class of 1944, passed away in September. She was a teacher at Wooster High, widow of author Robert Laxalt and sister-in-law to former Nevada governor and U.S. Senator Paul Laxalt.
- 2. **Don Manoukian**, Class of 1955, was a two time All-American football player at Reno High and played football, lifted weights, and wrestled at Stanford University. Don also played professional football for the Oakland Raiders after Stanford.. He became a professional wrestler and later a successful Real Estate Commercial developer. Don died in September.
- 3. **Carolyn Jean Carlon**, Class of 1943, was one of the first sworn Reno female police officers and was named officer of the year in 1984. She retired after 23 years and passed away in October.
- 4. **Elizabeth (Betty) Munley**, Class of 1951, recently died. She was a Navy veteran, an advocate for seniors, and served on the RHS Alumni Association Board for many years. In 1993 Betty was honored with the Nevada Attorney General's "Silver State Citizen's Award."
- 5. At the age of 95, Harry Ackerman, Class of 1936, is the oldest active member of the RHSAA.
- 6. Army veteran, **Major John Riggs**, Class of 1964, was the grand marshal for this year's Veteran's Day Parade in Reno on November 11<sup>th</sup>.
- 7. **Michael Wiess**, Class of 2009, is swimming the 400-meter medley and the 800 meter freestyle relay in world competition.
- 8. Entertainer, **Cami Thompson**, Class of 1976, performed her annual Christmas concert at Nightingale Concert Hall at UNR.
- 9. **Jeff Tomac**, Class of 1985 and RHS counselor, planned and organized the annual Sierra Nevada Classic wrestling tournament in Reno. The event brought in 86 schools and 1,000 wrestlers.

#### **BLAST FROM THE PAST**

From the Superior California News dated November 24, 1967:

## RENO SCHOOL IS DESTROYED BY BLAZE

Three firemen suffered minor injuries when a fire gutted an abandoned school near the downtown area, half of which had been sold only 10 days ago for \$500,000. The fire was discovered about 1 p.m. yesterday in Central Junior High School – formerly Reno High School..... Before the flames were controlled two hours later, most of the section facing West Street had been gutted.

The Washoe County School District sold half of the property Nov. 14 to a group represented by real estate broker Otto Ahner for \$486,000. School trustees had been trying to sell the property without success.

At that time, board members awarded a \$22,500 contract to L.A. Danson Co. to raze the building.







## FAREWELL TO LINK PIAZZO

One of Reno High School's distinguished alumni, Link Piazzo, class of 1937, passed away on November 14, 2014. He was 95 years old. Reno High, the RHS Alumni Association, and Reno community are indebted to this generous philanthropist.

In 1938, with his brother Chet, Link founded The Sportsman sporting goods store. In December of 1941, Link enlisted in the Army Air Corps. He became a B25 pilot and completed 67 combat missions during World War II. He was awarded 14 medals for his service, including the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Link and Chet resumed management of the Sportsman after the war, a career that would cover 60 years. Link served as president of the Western Sporting Goods Association and National Sporting Goods Association.

He began a lifelong commitment to community service as a result of the war. He said in an RGJ interview in 2013 that it was his war experiences – including many narrow escapes that he detailed in his autobiography, "It Can Always Be Worse. Never Give Up" – that prompted him to give back. "I was on my way home on the boat and said to myself, 'God saved me for a reason. If I ever have any amount of money, I want to help people in my community.' That's why I did it."

Link was an active member in a number of community organizations including the 20-30 Club, the Reno Rotary and the Sierra Sportswriters and Broadcast Association. He was the voice of UNR football and basketball games from 1947 through 1952. Link was the co-host of the Sportsman's Corner television show, later known as Sportsman's Trails. He was also a co-organizer of the first Reno Little League and the city's junior ski program.

He was awarded a number of honors for his civic activities. These honors included Junior Achievement Laureate, Reno Chamber of Commerce Civic Leader of the Year, Reno YMCA Red Triangle, Humane Society Community Protection Award, and the Board of Regents Nevada System of Higher Education and Distinguished Nevadan.

He donated money to Reno High School, Nevada Humane Society, University of Nevada Reno Athletics Department, Reno YMCA, Reno Rotary, Rotary International, Saint Mary's Hospital, City of Reno Community Center, and Pet Network Animal Friends of Incline Village. Through a special donation, the Reno High School Link Piazzo Alumni Center, our unique high school museum, was built in 1999 and opened in January 2001 on the Reno High campus. A display case honoring Link is found in the museum.

Governor Brian Sandoval said in a statement, "Link Piazzo is one of Northern Nevada's great icons. He served our country with dignity and honor and his generosity, goodwill and kindness have made an indelible impact on generations of Nevadans."

Link will be missed, but not forgotten. He left behind a lasting legacy, and our condolences go out to his family and friends.
