Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10053

The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10053 located in Verdi, Nevada is a small post that has been in the Verdi community for more than 50 years. The current building was deeded to the post from the local Odd Fellows chapter before it disbanded. The building was an old horse stable that was part of the Verdi Lumber Company. Pictures of the building as a stable are displayed at the Verdi Historical Society located on 2nd street in Verdi.

VFW Post 10053 strongly supports the national motto of "No one does More for Veterans" by actively volunteering at numerous veterans events. Their support doesn't stop there. They also have a strong community involvement, with programs that recognize teachers, provide student scholarships, and present safety awards to recognize our first responders (EMT's, Firefighters and Peace officers).

The post supports many schools in northwest Reno and Verdi, one of them being **Reno High School**. They have donated to the "We the People Program" which teaches students about the Constitution of the United States of America and includes a competition. The **Reno High team** has won the local competition the last two years and travelled to Washington D.C. to compete nationally. The post awards Scholarships through their "Voice of Democracy" essay contest. This contest has been won by a **Reno High student** the past two years. This year, the Post selected **Reno High teacher** Richard Clark as its Teacher of the Year at the high school level. He went on to win the District and State awards as well.





The post also supports the **Reno High JROTC** program in several ways. They attend the Huskie Battalion Awards Night where this year three members of the post made presentations for three different Veterans Service Organizations including the VFW. Products in the former vein were colorful eye-catching posters for the World's Fair, dignified portraits, and attractive still-life studies. Intricate work in leather and metal, in shadowed wood carvings, in lacquered plaques, and in decorative pottery represented the crafts.



Constantly busy were the shop classes not only in the construction of desks, cupboards, lamps, and chests, but in the improvement of room space about the school.
