Reno High Wrestler Andrew Berreyesa - RHS grad 2017

Andrew was a 2017 graduate of Reno High. While here he was a 4 time state finalist winning 2 state wrestling titles in 2015 & 2017 at 170 pounds. His overall high school career record was 197 wins and 12 losses. His wrestling career is much broader than his wins and those two state titles. Andrew began wrestling at 6 years old, often wrestling with his much older brother Dereck. He had much success in youth wrestling, and was part of the Northwest Knights wrestling club. In high school Andrew lettered in both Wrestling and Football and while at Reno High, he was invited to train at the US Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs.

Andrew committed to Cornell University to wrestle, and to gain additional experience, he took a "gap year" (Ivy League schools do not allow red-shirting, so this is the way to accomplish this) and attended Finger Lakes Prep Academy. While at Finger Lakes Andrew is able to compete in tournaments as an unattached competitor against all college wrestlers. This past season he went 26-7 only losing to older NCAA ranked wrestlers.

Since graduating from Reno High, Andrew has wrestled across the US and in several countries including Sweden, Slovakia, and Austria. His first national Championship was in the elite Fargo National Wrestling tournament, where he won the 170 pound Greco-Roman title. Next came the US Open Wrestling tournament in Las Vegas where Andrew won the US Junior Title. This tournament was a qualifier for the US Junior National Wrestling Team where Andrew secured a spot by winning his final Challenge Tournament. This accomplishment has been the height of Andrew's career and an elite honor to represent the United States at the World Championships in Slovakia. In a 37 man bracket, Andrew wrestled his way to the finals securing a medal. In his Finals Match Andrew wrestled a 2 time world champion and #1 seed from Russia. Although he lost this match and ended with a Silver Medal, very few can say that they are the second best in the WORLD!!!!

Garrett Hampson

Reno High first fielded a baseball team in the spring of 1939. Considered a "minor sport," the team would play against any opponent including inmates from the Nevada State Prison, UNR fraternities and the Stewart Indian School. After World War II, baseball crossed the threshold to become a varsity sport and every subsequent spring, the Huskies have put forth one of the finest teams in Northern Nevada. Despite five state championships, only two players have risen to the ranks of the highest echelon of the sport. The first was right handed pitcher Shawn Boskie who played for six teams during his nine year career while racking up a 5.14 ERA. Boskie retired at the conclusion of the 1998 season and currently resides in Scottsdale, Arizona.



On July 21, 2018, a 23 year old Reno High grad donned a Colorado Rockies uniform and stepped into the dugout at Chase Field, not far from Boskie's house, to make his major league debut against the Diamondbacks. In the top of the 5th inning, the right handed batter drove a curveball off the left field wall, scoring a run, and beginning Garrett Hampson's major league career.





Hampson grew up like many other Reno High boys who had aspirations of playing major league baseball. He played little league at Reno National and lived across the street from the fields. He would hop the fence at Swope and hit balls in the batting cages for hours. As a Huskie, Garrett excelled on both the baseball diamond and basketball court. He batted .492 with 36 RBIs and 21 stolen bases his senior year. Following high school, the major leagues tempted him. He was drafted in the 26th round of the 2013 draft. Garrett turned down the offer and began his collegiate career at Long Beach State University. While in college, Garrett was the Big West Freshman Player of the Year in 2014 and was selected to the USA Collegiate National Team. After two College World Series appearances with the Dirtbags, Garrett entered the MLB draft and was selected in the 3rd round by the Colorado Rockies. He spent the 2017 and early 2018 season on a meteoric rise through the Rockies farm system until his Major League debut.

For the remainder of the 2018 season, Garrett filled in for injured starters as a utility player and returned to the minors until the roster expansion in September when he was called back up. While in the big leagues, Garrett posted a respectable .275 batting average with a couple of stolen bases. According to multiple sources, Garrett stands a very good chance at being the starting second basemen for the Rockies on Opening Day in 2019. If you are looking for a reason to follow major league baseball, keep your eyes on the Colorado Rockies and RHS alum Garrett Hampson.
