







### **AROUND RHS CAMPUS**

- 1. Statistics for the class of 2022: According to RHS Principal Kris Hackbusch, these are class accomplishments: 430 graduates, 142 National Honor Society members, 12 National Merit Commended Scholars, 4 National Merit Semi Finalist, 3 National Merit finalist, 3 US Presidential Scholars, 88 Career Tech Education Completers. Athletically, they won 9 team and/or individual regional/division championships. Team and individual state titles include Boys Cross Country, Rifle team, swimming, track, and We the People. National honors include Rifle team, Baseball, We the People, JROTC Robotics, Speech and Debate and Skills USA. There are 171 honors diplomas, 74 advanced diplomas, 30 students who graduated with a 4.0 GPA. The class of 2022 has been offered approximately \$8 million in scholarship monies which is double any amount ever been offered previously.
- 2. The RGJ published a list of the outstanding graduate in each school in the Washoe County School District. Reno's winner was Dallasia Samuels. She was also the winner of the Westover Family Scholarship.

#### **IN MEMORIUIM**

Art Collins passed away on June 13, 2022 at the age of 76. He grew up in Glendale, CA where he threw the javelin in high school. He joined the US Air Force in 1966 and was recruited to join Air America and was stationed in Thailand for 3 years during the Viet Nam War. Later he attended UNR where he earned a bachelor's and Master's degrees. While at Reno High School, Art was an Industrial Arts teacher and a counselor as well as a ski coach from 1977 to 2003. Upon his retirement, he continued to oversee the high school ski racing program for many years. He was recently inducted into the Nevada Hall of Fame for his ski coaching. Art was also involved as a trainer for the US jujitsu team and traveled internationally with the team. Art touched the lives of many young people in his role as teacher, counselor, and coach as well as his volunteer work with the US jujitsu team.

- 1. RHS baseball coach, Pete Savage, class of 1979, recorded his 800<sup>th</sup> career win with the Huskies. Savage told the RGJ that the number is a reflection of having outstanding assistant coaches and players who are committed to the process in addition to their families. Savage has been the RHS baseball coach for 27 years.
- 2. Reno Judge Dorothy Nash Holmes, class of 1968, retired with 45 years of service. She became one of the first 75 women to pass the bar in Nevada, and not only worked as a prosecutor, but worked for the Nevada Department of Corrections, where she created the state's first programs to provide treatment, training, and rehabilitation for inmates. Judge Nash Holmes worked for the federal government incarcerating international narcotics smugglers.

# THE STORY BEHIND THE "BLOCK R"

Norm Beasley, Class of 1964, provided an article (RGJ 7/2/2001) written by Rollan Melton about the Block R that was established on the side of Peavine Mountain. This is not to be confused with the Reno Varsity Letterman's Club – the Block R.

"The Block R was born in the spring of 1962, just weeks before graduation. The group of RHS senior boys who dreamed up the idea and got it in place. The about-to-graduate boys hiked to the future Block R site and designed and mapped the soon-to-be born signature, using stakes, string and a basic understanding of geometry taught to them by RHS mathematics teacher E'Lois Campbell. She taught at RHS, from which she graduated in 1934, from 1950 to 1973.

"The Block R site was chosen because the land was owned by Marcelino Landa, a rancher and friend of John Gascue's father. Mr. Landa gave his enthusiastic permission to the youngsters to stake their claim on the site.

"The energetic boys worked many Sundays, rearranging rocks to suit their mission. The teenagers called themselves Rock R Society, and they kept their membership number low to keep their endeavor a secret.

"However, word of their undercover project leaked out before they were scheduled to paint the R.

"The principal of RHS at that time was David Finch, a former combat U.S. Marine. He told the innovative boys that if they continued their Peavine endeavor, they would not graduate. Not a boy was willing to take that risk. So, they backed off.

"But their persistence did not remain dormant."

A few weeks after the boys had graduation diplomas safe in hand, the Block R glowed down on Reno, new bathed/painted with a light coat of lime and water mixture.

The tradition of brightening the Block R continues with bands of graduating senior boys and girls still trekking every two years or so up Peavine to where the senior boys in the Class of '62 took it upon their enterprising selves to make history."

In October 2007 Reno High and McQueen High JROTC units travelled up the steep hillside and painted the huge Block R rocks with donated white paint and mops. It is unsure if it has been painted since.
